Dear Secretary Noem,

I am writing to respectfully urge the Department of Homeland Security and Immigration and Customs Enforcement to conduct a full review of whether professional climate radical Greta Thunberg should be granted entry into the United States in the future, based on a pattern of international disruptive conduct and her role as a known agitator.

Most recently, Ms. Thunberg participated in a highly publicized protest in Venice in which activist groups dyed the city's Grand Canal bright green. According to media reports, Ms. Thunberg was among the demonstrators involved, received a fine from local authorities for the action, and was subsequently banned from entering the city for a certain amount of time as a result.<sup>1</sup>

The Venice vandalism occurred less than two months after Ms. Thunberg was removed from Israel, where authorities determined that her on-the-ground political activity and participation in demonstrations were inconsistent with the conditions of her entry and therefore incompatible with the terms of her stay. <sup>2</sup>

These incidents fit a broader pattern: where Ms. Thunberg travels, significant disruption often follows. Her activities frequently overlap with Extinction Rebellion, Just Stop Oil, and similarly aligned activist groups—organizations that have engaged in high-impact protest actions widely described as vandalism or public disorder.

Greta Thunberg has consistently aligned herself with activist organizations known for high-impact disruptive actions, including Extinction Rebellion and Just Stop Oil.<sup>3</sup> While she has not been present at *every* incident attributed to these groups, she publicly supports their campaigns, marched alongside their members, and participated in joint demonstrations. Her involvement with and endorsement of these organizations place her squarely within the same protest ecosystem responsible for repeated acts of property damage, public obstruction, and large-scale disruption.

Extinction Rebellion and its affiliates have carried out numerous disruptive and vandalistic acts in recent years, including coordinated green-dye actions that targeted rivers, fountains, and the Grand Canal in Italy<sup>4</sup>; the smashing of windows at HSBC's

London headquarters in 2021;<sup>5</sup> and a 2020 blockade of major UK newspaper printing presses that halted distribution nationwide.<sup>6</sup> Just Stop Oil, a closely associated group, has engaged in highly publicized attacks on artwork such as throwing soup on Van Gogh's Sunflowers<sup>7</sup> and staging repeated glue-on and paint-based disruptions in national museums<sup>8</sup>, as well as orchestrating dangerous roadway blockades that brought major British motorways to a standstill.<sup>9</sup> These actions, widely reported, illustrate the disruptive record of the very groups Thunberg has chosen to support and amplify.

The United States has both the right and the obligation to evaluate whether the entry of a foreign national poses a risk to public order, infrastructure, or significant cultural and historical assets. Ms. Thunberg's ongoing involvement in actions that result in vandalism, obstruction, or arrests overseas raises legitimate questions as to whether similar disruptions could occur on U.S. soil.

This request is not ideological; it is rooted in the federal government's responsibility to protect:

- U.S. infrastructure
- public safety
- national landmarks and cultural sites
- economic activity impacted by large-scale blockades or disruptions

Your agency has taken unprecedented steps to rid the homeland of criminal illegals who have done the nation great harm, and the American people not only overwhelmingly support you but are also much safer thanks to your decisive actions and bold leadership. To continue this success, we ask that careful consideration be given to foreign nationals who are allowed into the country. Operatives from radical climate groups like Extinction Rebellion and Just Stop Oil only come to America for one purpose: disruption, and usually with violence. That is why Power The Future urges you to preclude these extremists, including Greta Thunberg, to be deny entry onto sovereign American soil. America is suffering from enough internal political violence that additional foreign born, foreign funded extremists should not be welcomed.

Thank you for your attention to this matter and for your service in protecting our nation.
